

## Minister of Economy and Commerce welcomes 29 countries & over 421 exhibitors at the opening of Project Qatar 2018

- Future Projects Qatar Conferencekicks off today to explore untapped growth prospects in construction sector
- Nearly QR200 billion allocated towards development in 7 different sectors

Under the patronage of H.E. Sheikh Abdullah bin Nasser bin Khalifa Al-Thani, the Prime Minister and Minister of Interior of Qatar, Project Qatar 2018, the 15<sup>th</sup> edition of the International Trade Exhibition for Construction Technology, Building Materials, Equipment and Environmental Technology, kicked off today (Monday, May 7, 2018). The event was inaugurated by The Minister of Commerce and Economy H.E. Some of the world's leading companies are showcasing their products and services which belong to the top ten construction-related needs in the sector such as: building materials; electrical supplies; construction systems and technology; engineering and design services; marble blocks, tiles and slabs; pipes and fittings; steel products; marble finished products; stone blocks, slabs and finished products; and ceramic tiles and granite from 29 countries.

development in the country, advanced cooling solutions for stadiums and sports facilities, and an update of the number of sports facilities under construction.
